


DENSITY OF AFRICAN AMERICAN POPULATION IN PORTLAND

Historically, black populations in Portland have been concentrated in certain parts of the city. This can be seen from early Vanport to the historic Albina neighborhood, and even present day in pockets across town. Looking at trends of this population movement, it becomes more clear to see the density of present day and how that's been shaped historically.

By collecting data on population, income, household size, and age of many of the surrounding neighborhoods in Portland, a snapshot of density

starts to emerge. Upon collecting that data, key neighborhoods in NE Portland became the focus of this research. Many factors contribute to this movement. These neighborhoods have connections to present day black populations, but also historic connections to movements and trends.


