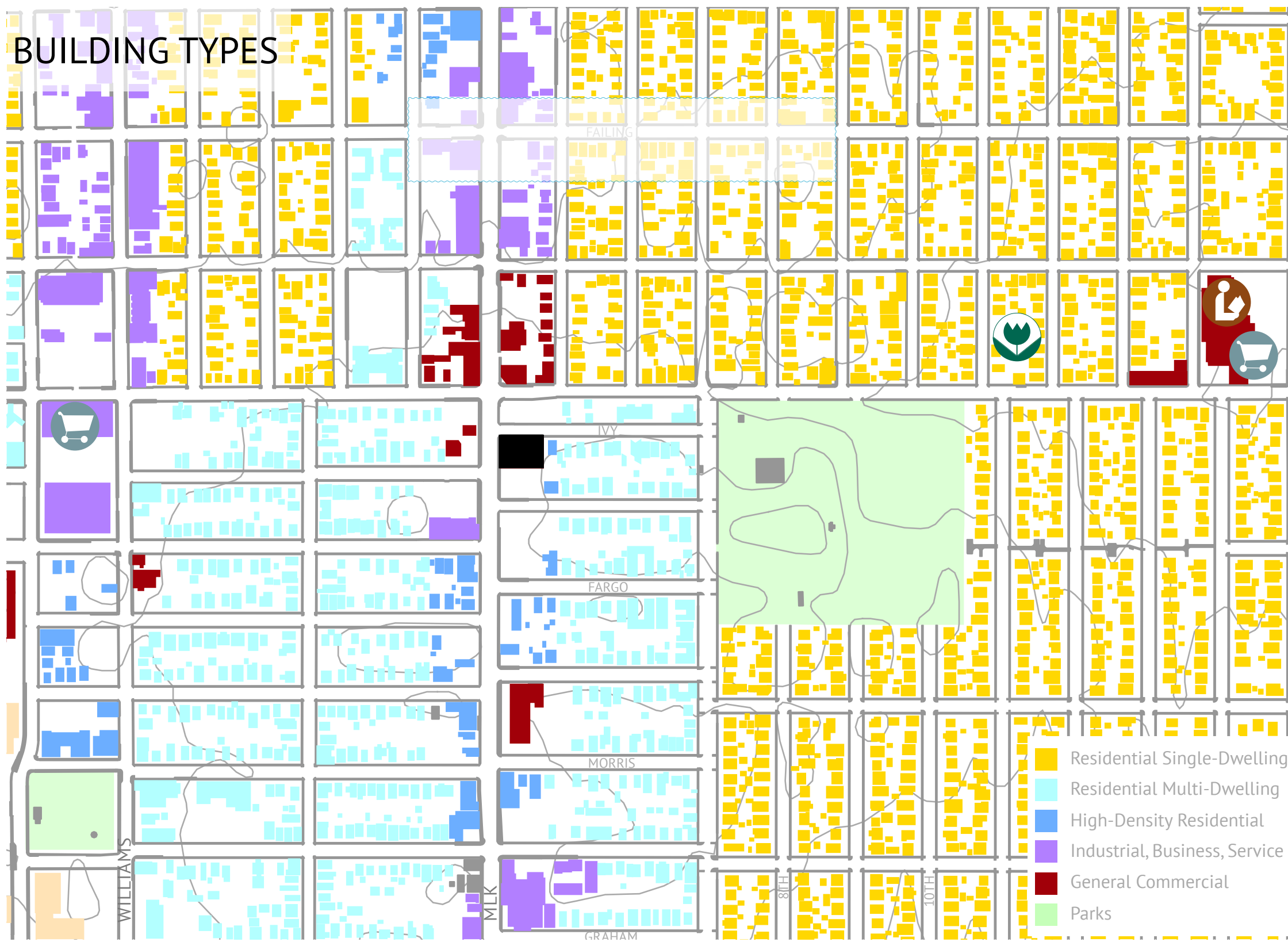

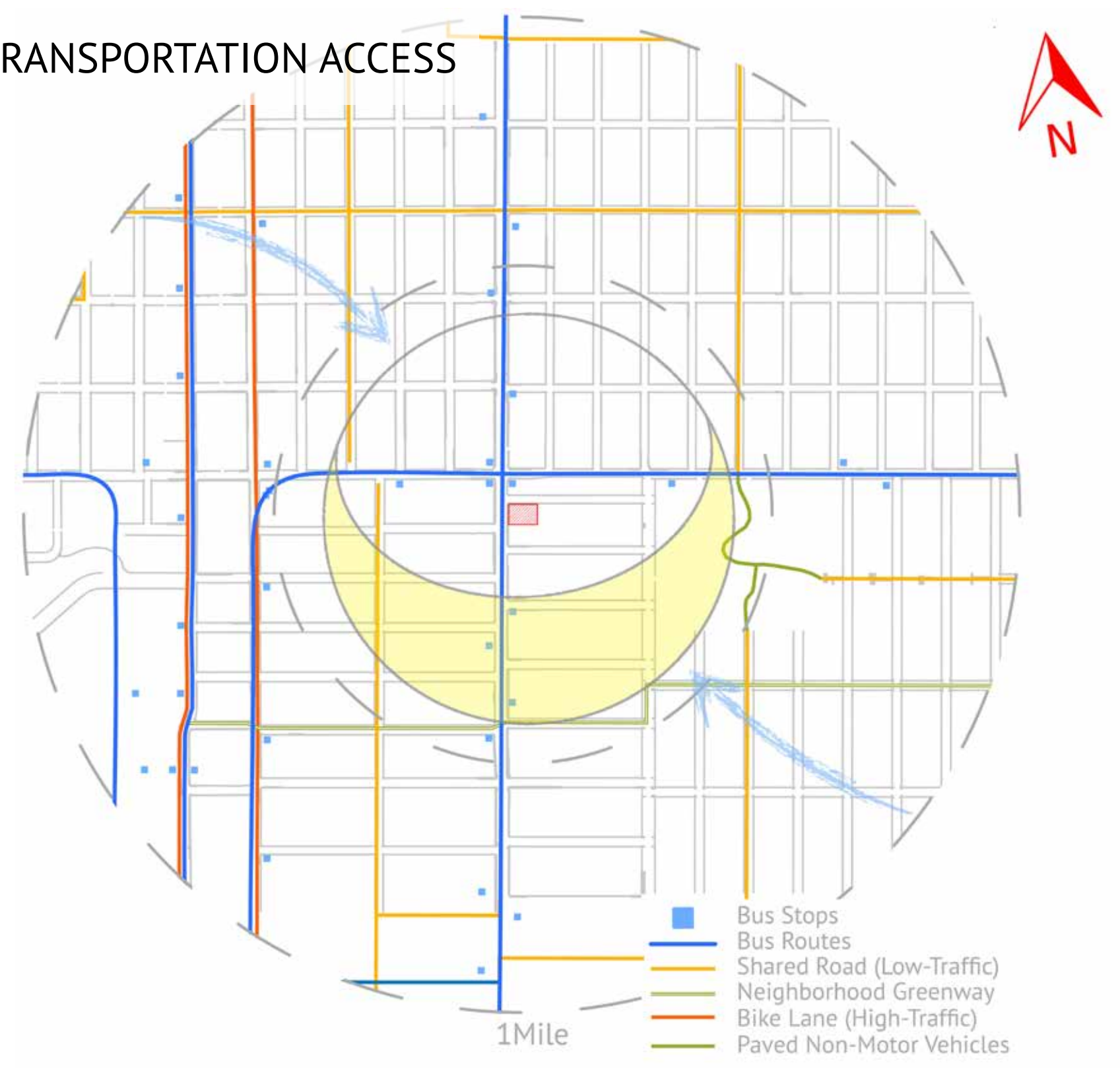

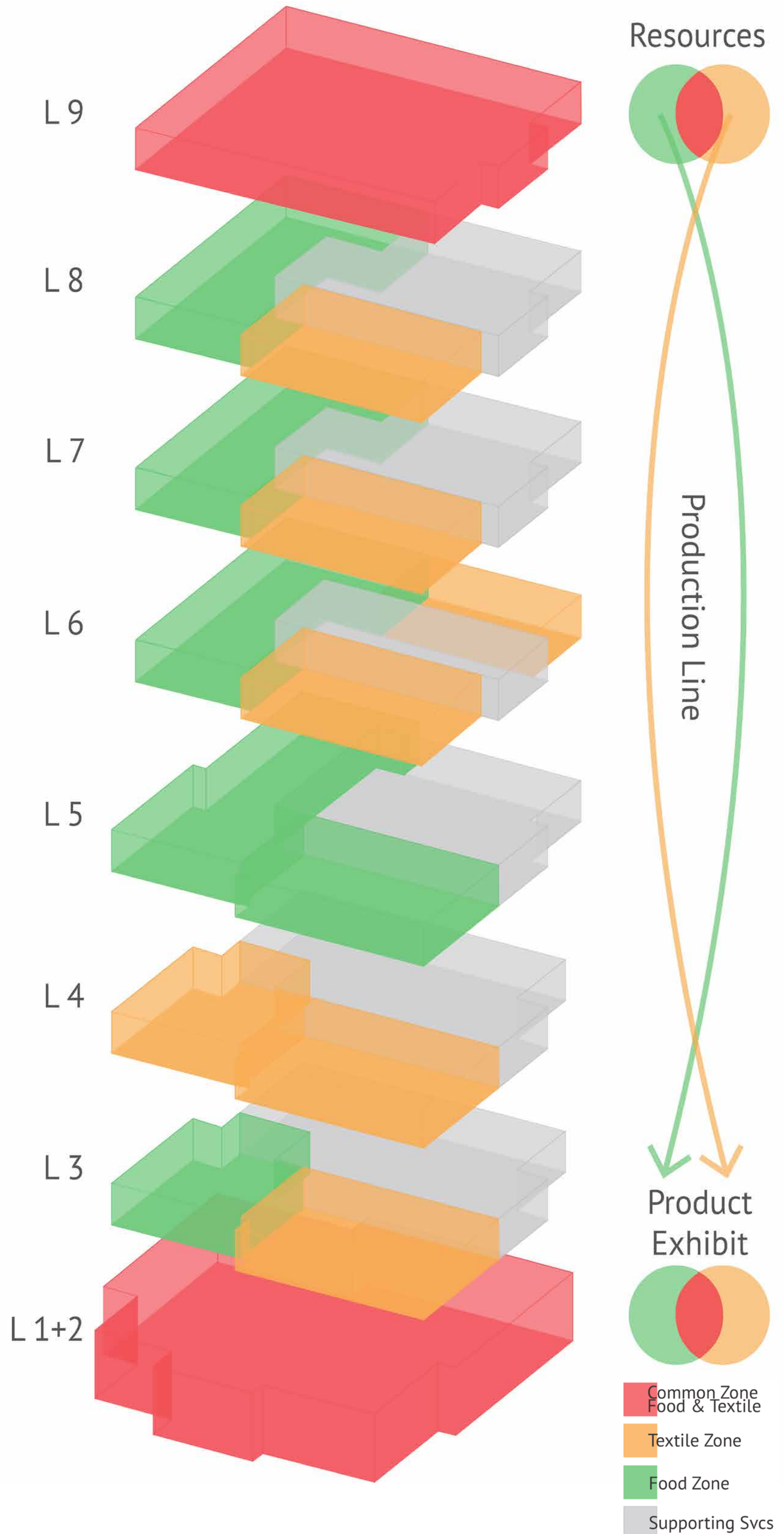

BUILDING PROGRAM

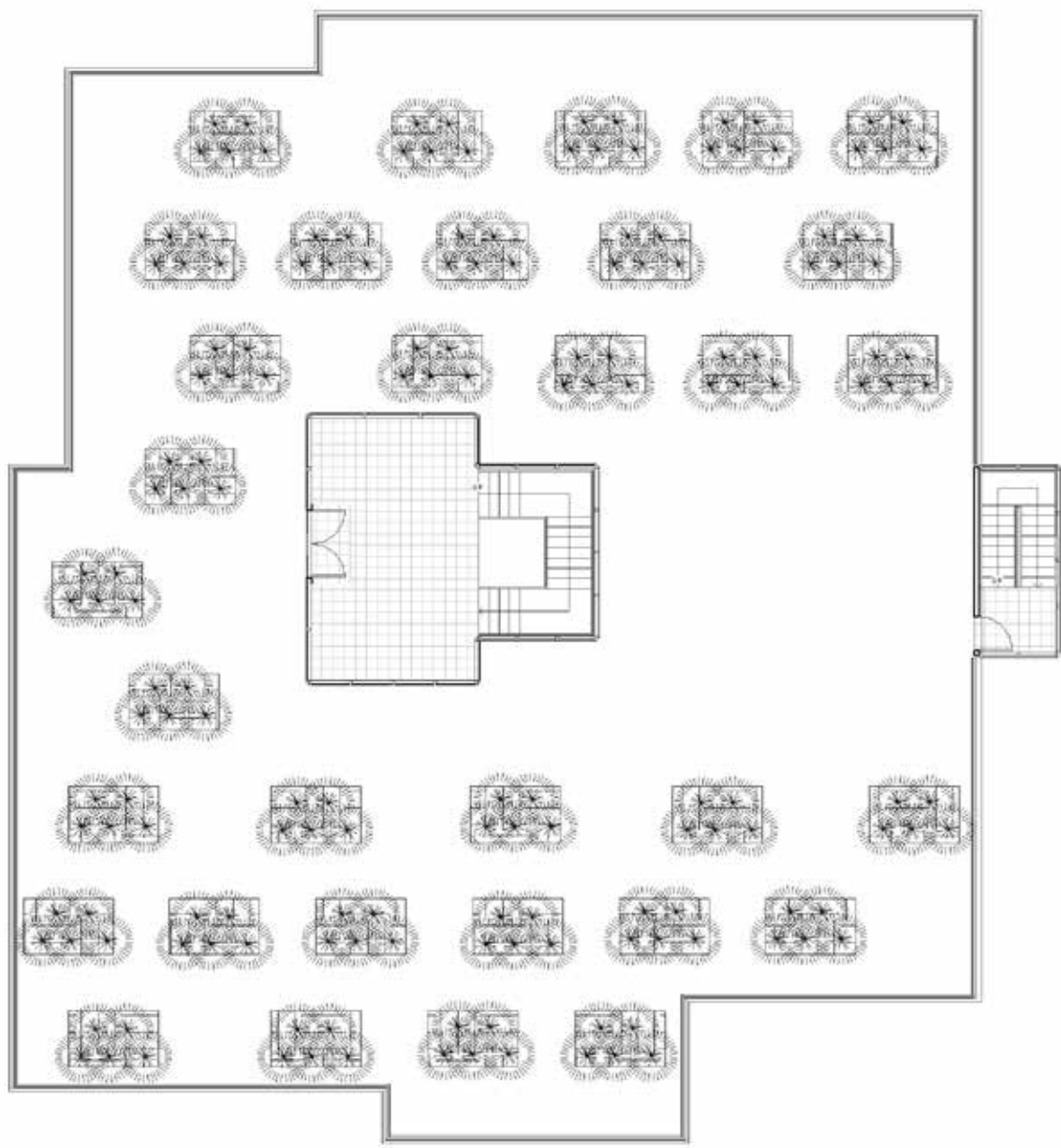
The building serves two making activities Food and Textile making. The program of the building is similar to a production line. It begins on top and works its way down. Starting with raw materials, processing, production, and product exhibition. Both cultural activities begin on common ground, utilizing the roof garden. Plants grown may serve both the making of food and the making of textile. These activities then occur simultaneously sharing floors. For example both processing of produce and textile take place on Level 8. As you descend down the building the level of skill and proficiency increases. The bottom two floors is where they meet and merge again; creating a welcoming spontaneous market to showcase what the building is about. The market brings people in and tells the story of the building in an unexpected order.

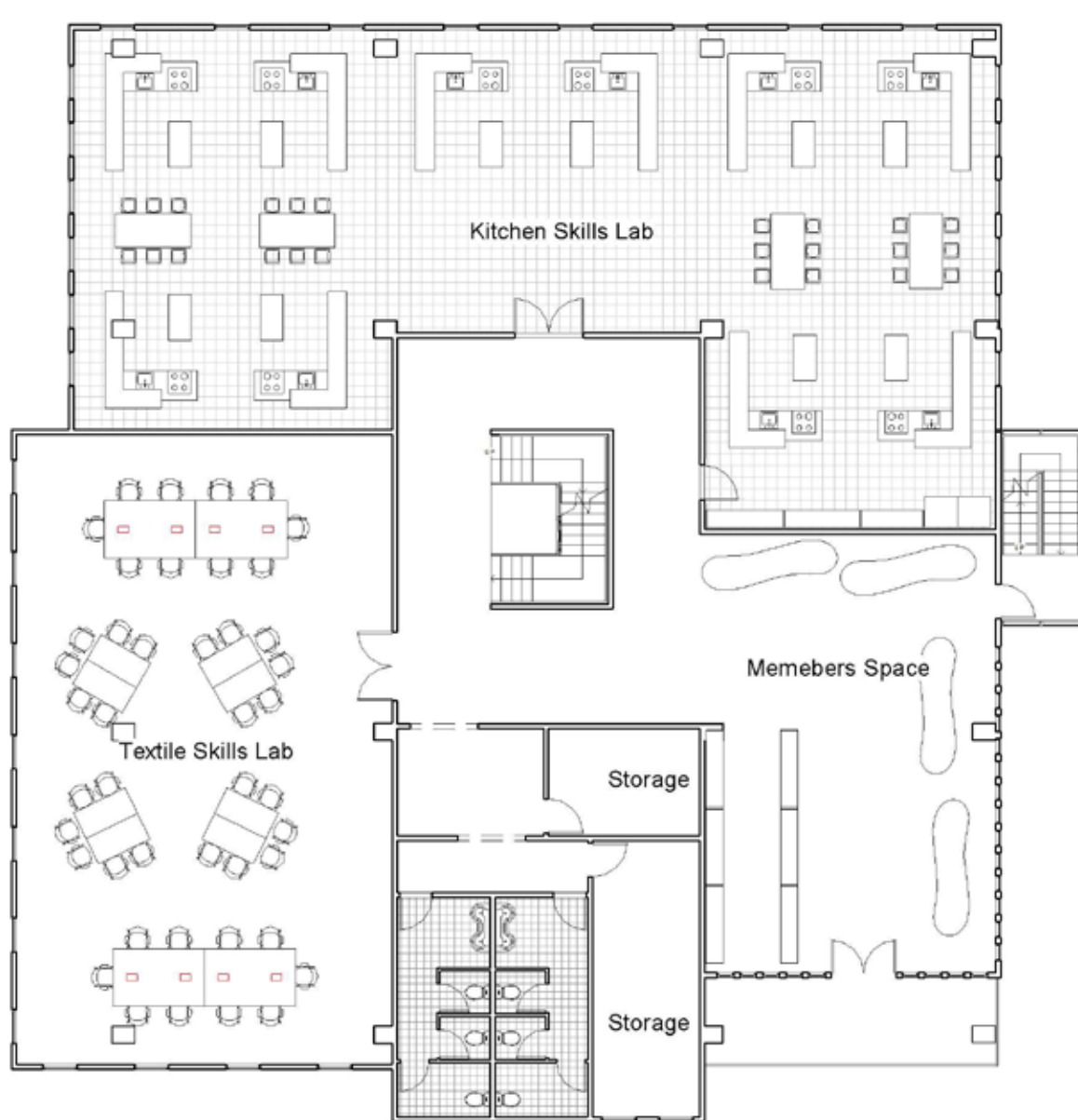

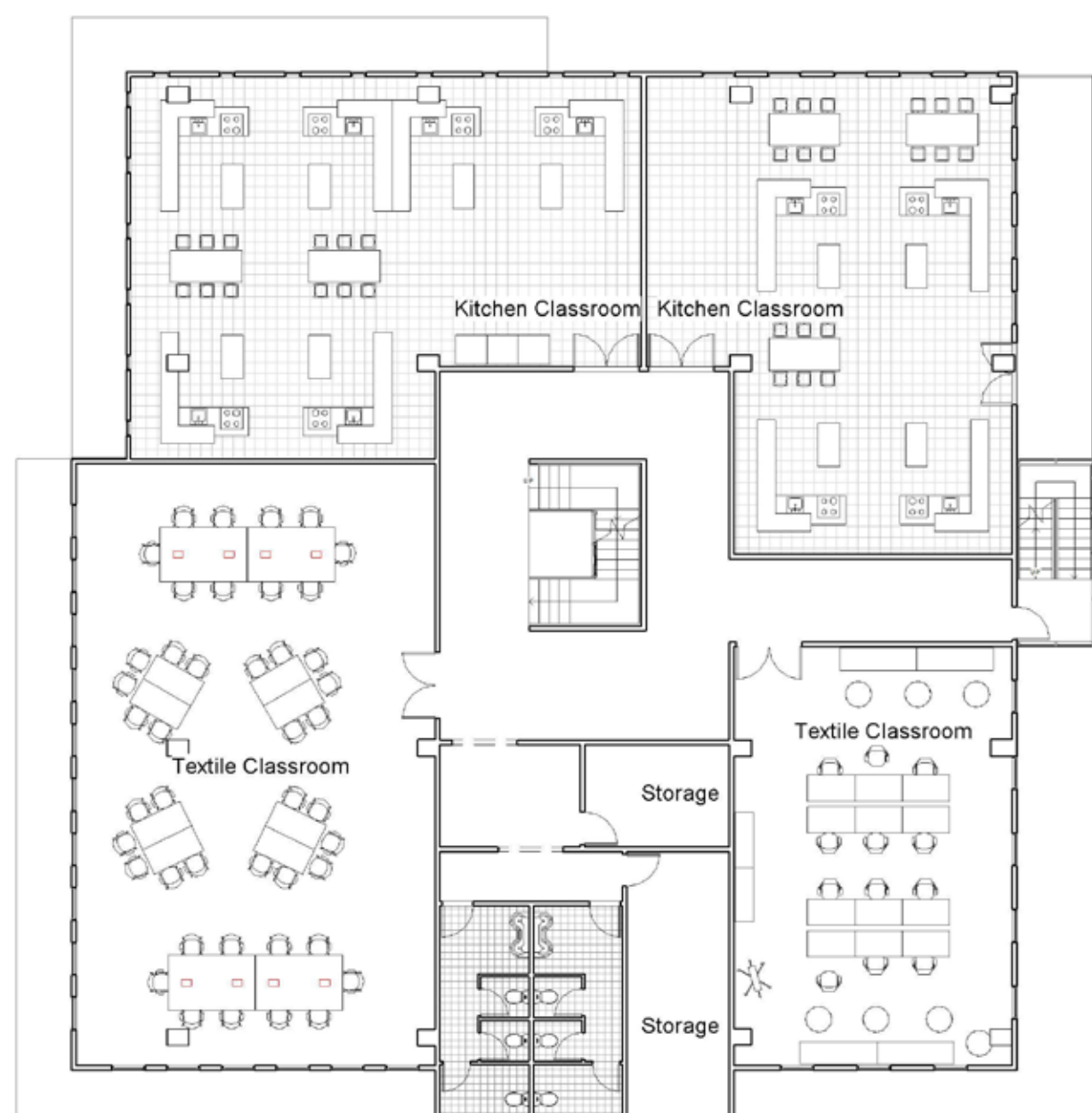

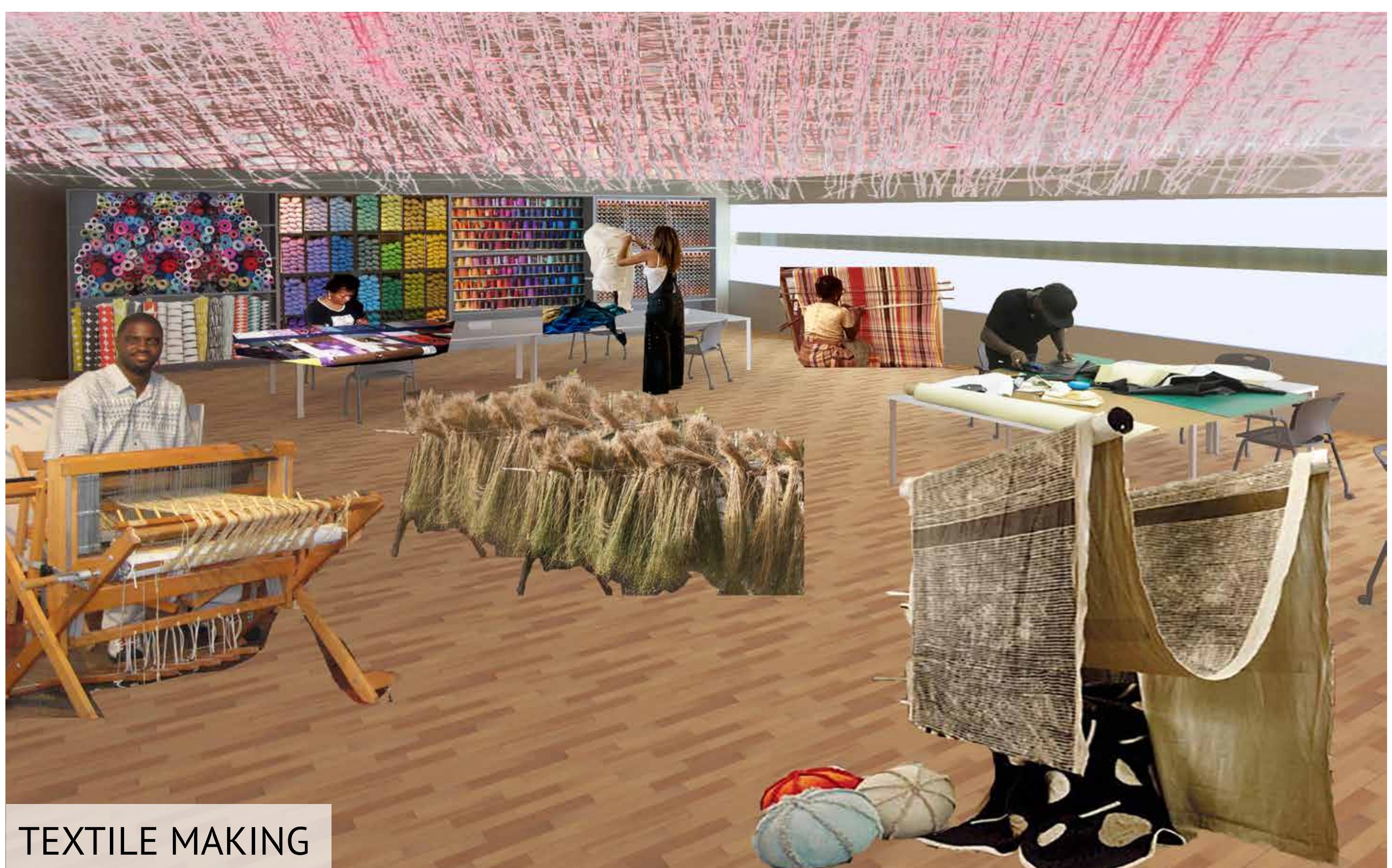
FOOD & TEXTILE ROOF GARDEN

Food making facilities are dedicated for processing, learning, and independent use



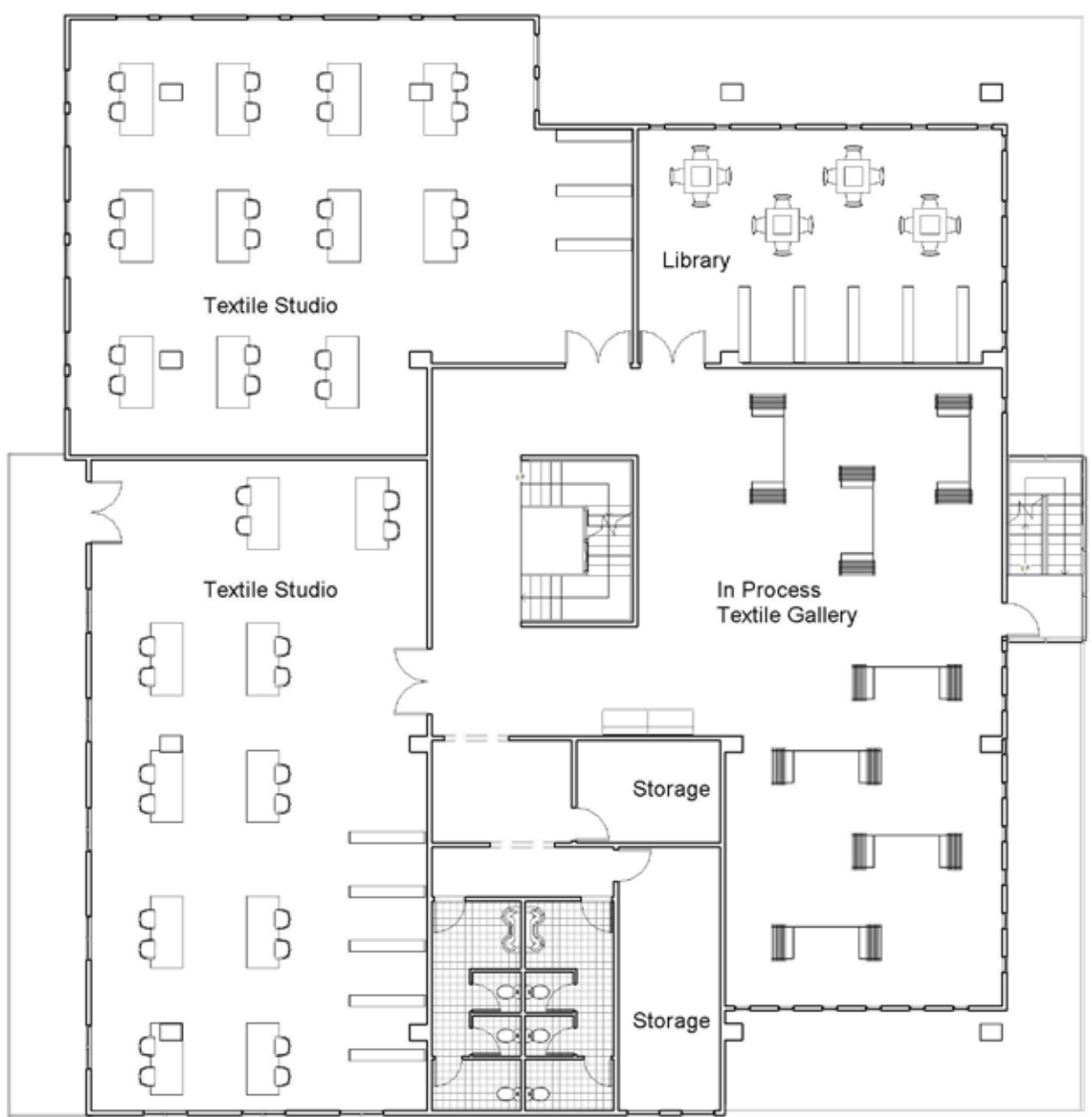
TEXTILE MAKING

Textile making facilities are dedicated for processing, learning, and independent use

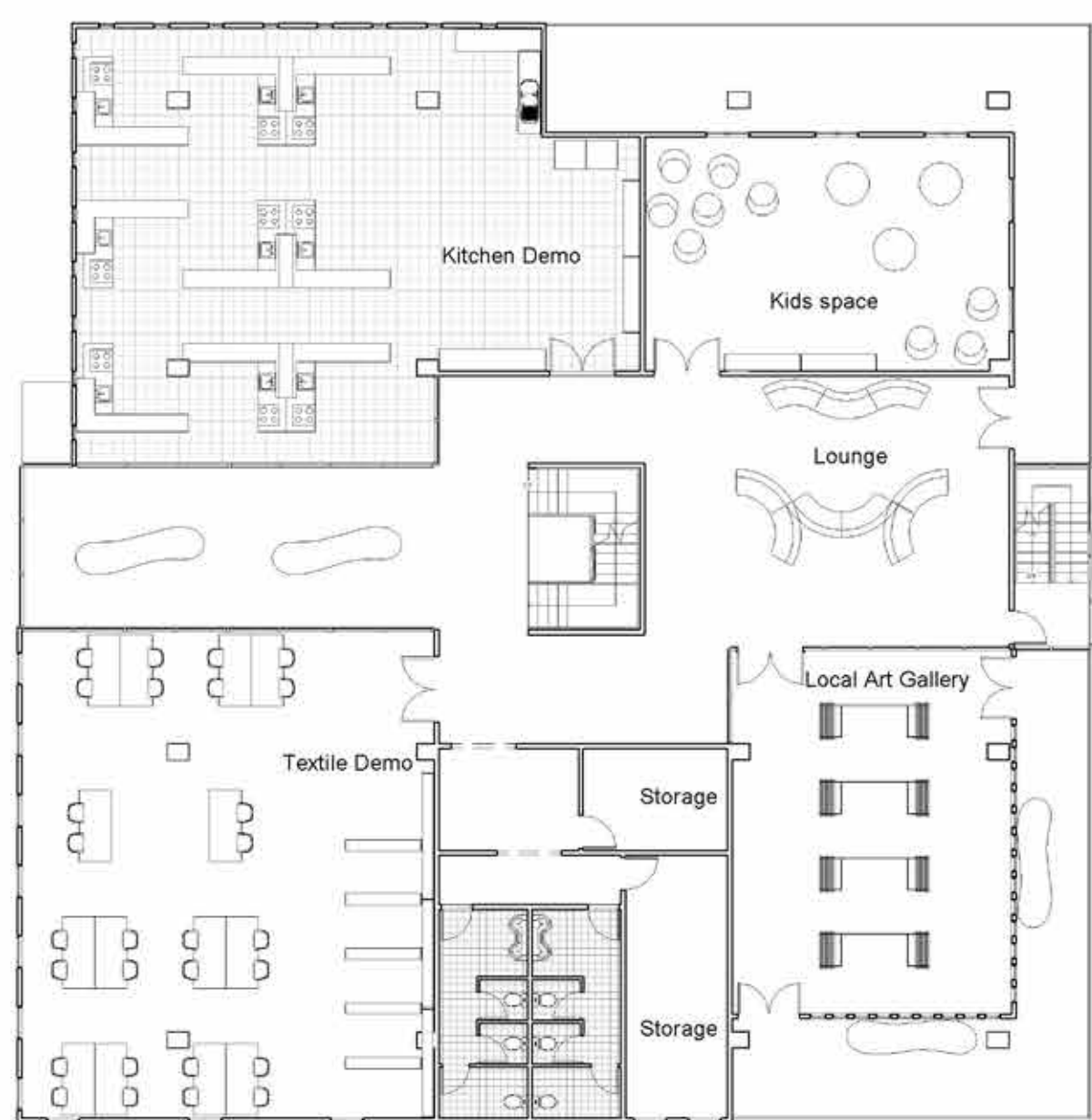

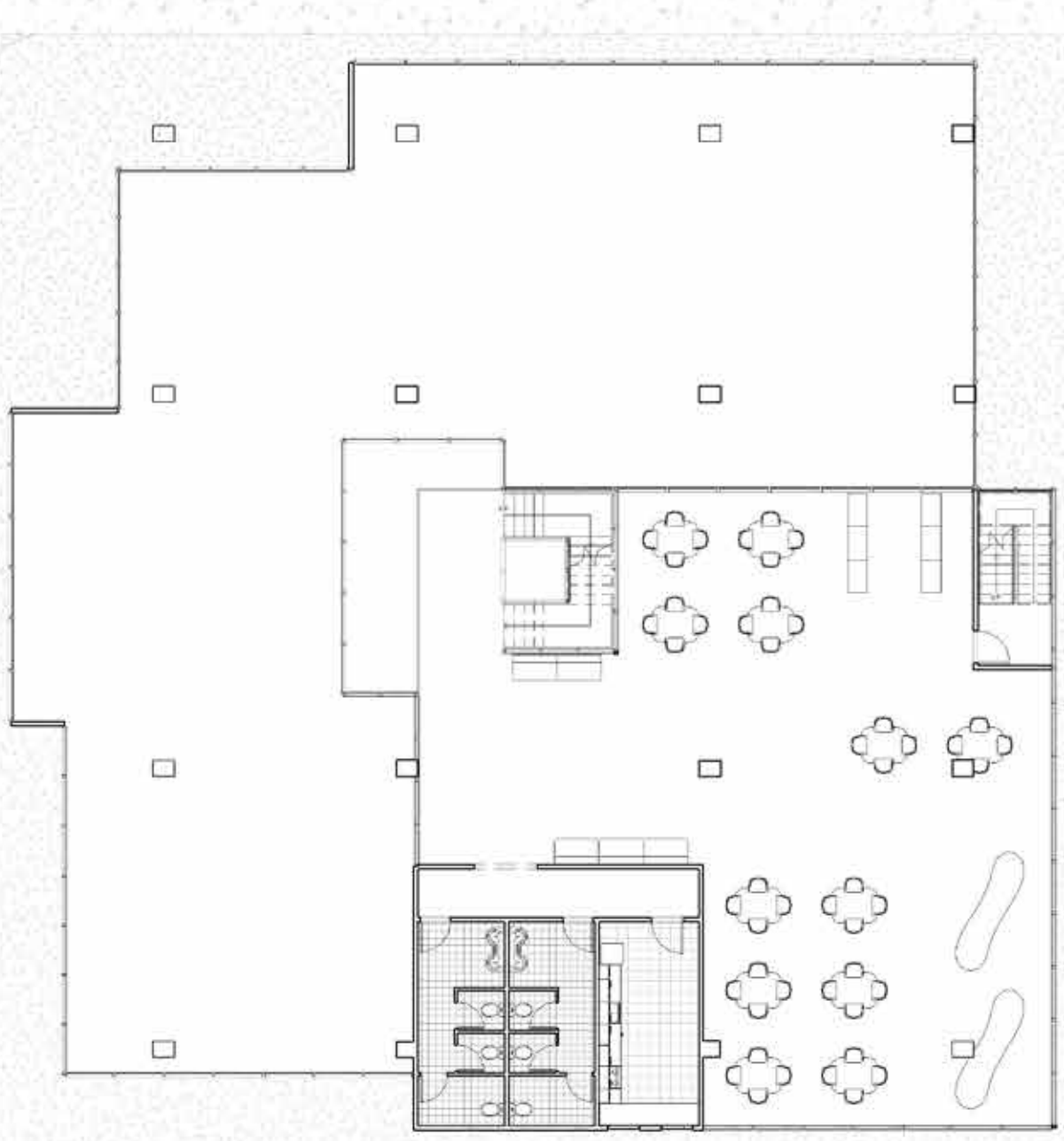
Level 5

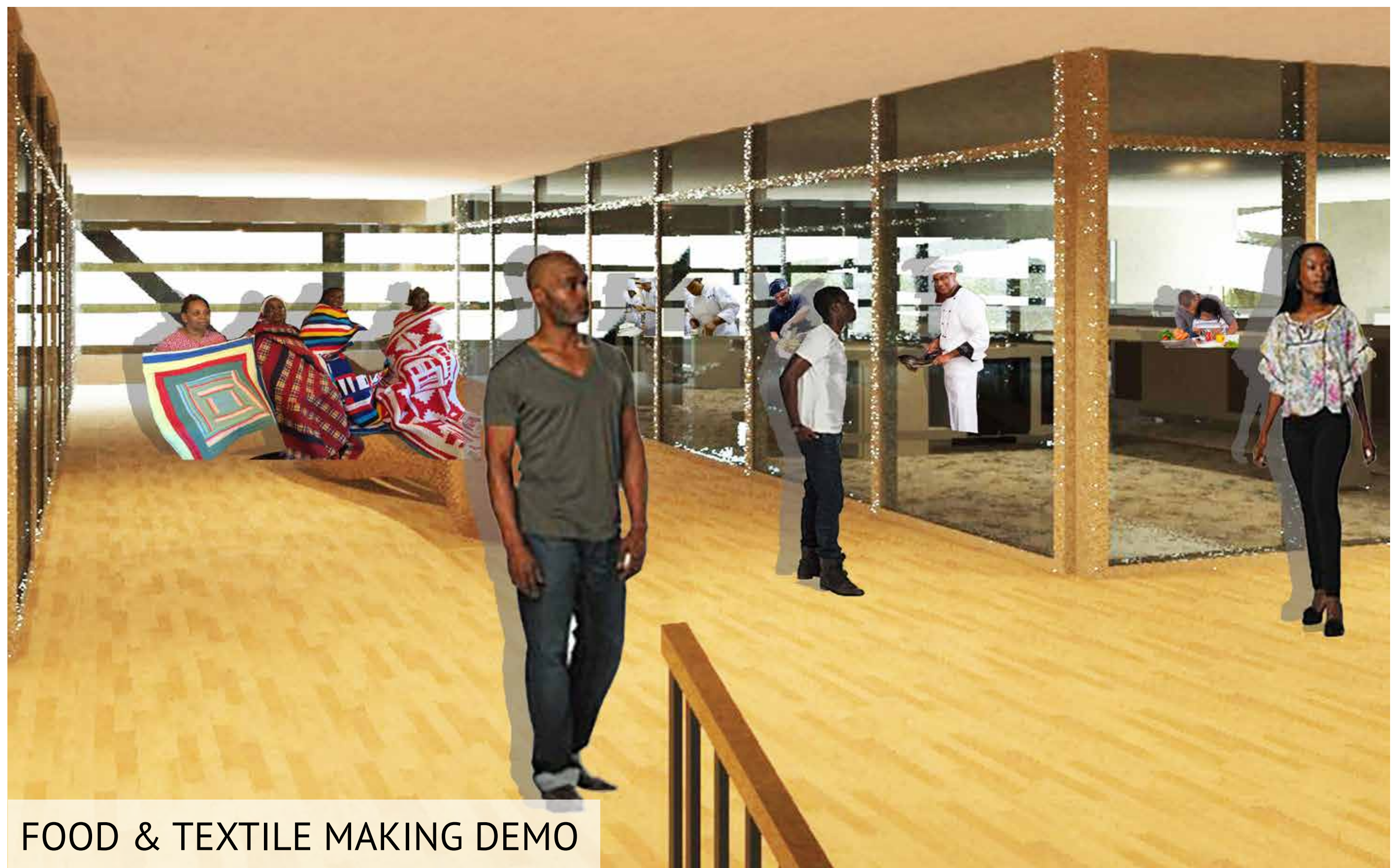

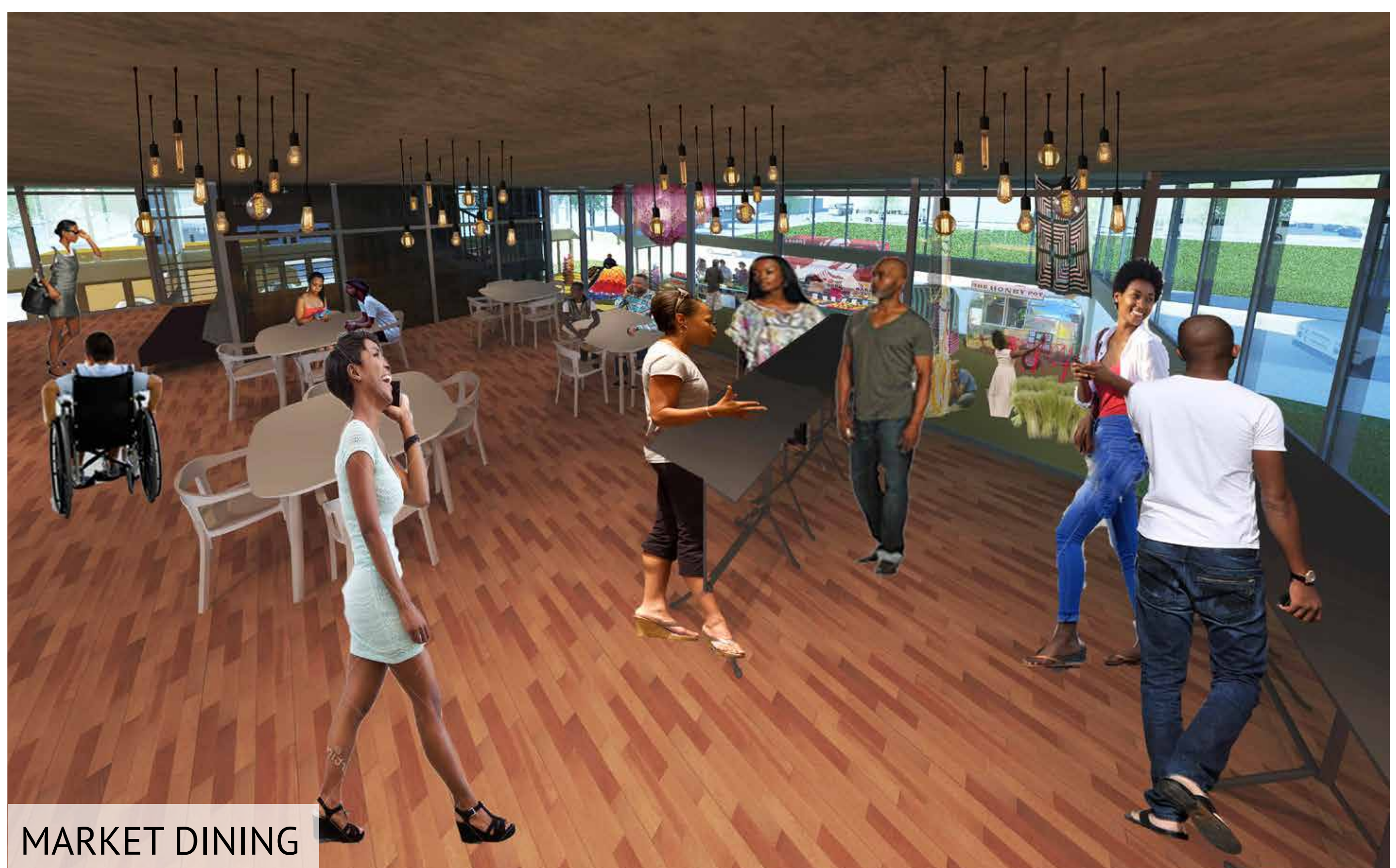
IN-PROCESS TEXTILE GALLERY
